Isaiah 35:1-10, *James 5:7-10; “Patience Is Love”

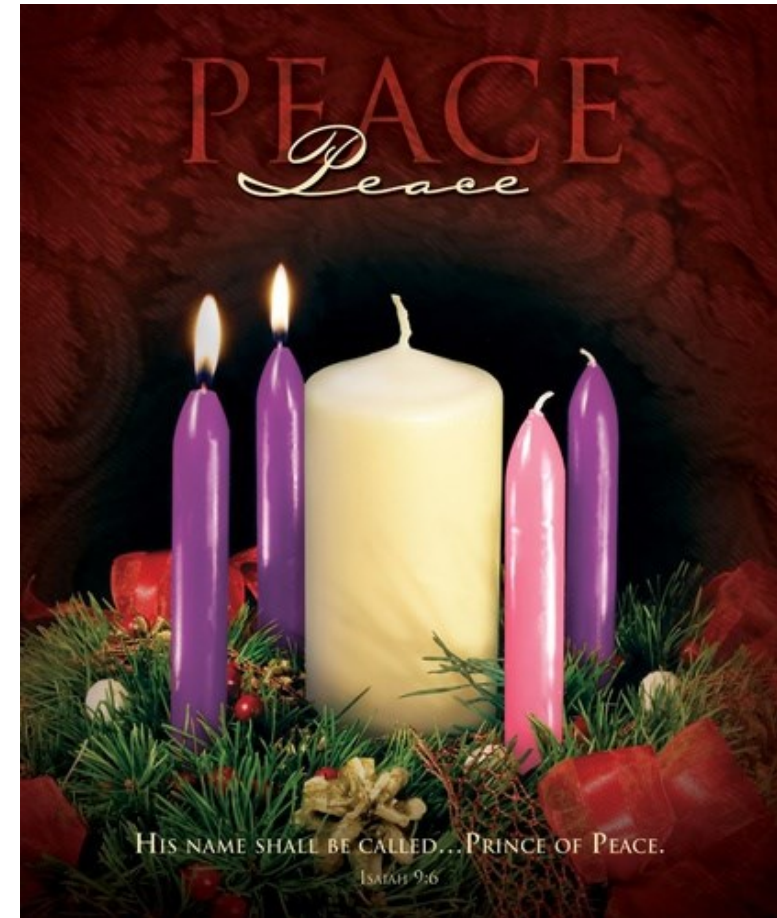
