Today we gather to celebrate the life of Edwin Jaquins, a beloved husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, teacher, veteran, and faithful servant of God.

Born in Walla Walla, Washington, on May 28, 1934, Edwin lived a life marked by dedication, humility, and unwavering love for his family and community. After serving proudly in the United States Navy during the Korean War, Edwin and his family settled in Port Angeles, where he discovered his calling as a teacher. For 30 years, he devoted himself to the students of Port Angeles, shaping young lives with patience, kindness, and quiet strength.

Edwin's life was grounded in his Christian faith. As a member of First Presbyterian Church for 58 years, he served and worshipped faithfully, forming lifelong friendships and living out his belief in compassion and service to others.

He loved the outdoors, especially fishing, which brought him peace and joy throughout his life. Whether enjoying a quiet morning on the water or sharing stories with family, these simple moments were among his favorites.

Edwin is survived by his wife of 70 years, Glenda Jaquins; his children Terrice Waltenburg (Carl) and Dusty Jaquins (Debbie); his eight grandchildren; and eleven great-grandchildren, each of whom he cherished deeply. He is preceded in death by his youngest daughter, Rebecca Liffick, whose memory continued to live close to his heart.
