Litany of Remembrance

We will sing a verse of “O Come, O Come, Emmanuel” (#61) after each candle is lit.



We light this first candle to remember those whom we have loved and lost. (v. 1)



We light this second candle to remember the pain of loss. (v. 2)



We light this third candle to remember ourselves this Christmas time. (v. 6)



We light this fourth candle to remember the pain of the world. (v. 7)

Closing Prayer and Lord's Prayer

Gentle God, be with us in the waiting.

Wrap your arms around us in love and teach us to trust that a new day is coming.

Be a lamplight in the darkness of our night and protect us from danger until a new day dawns.

All this we pray in the name of your son, the light of the world, who taught us to pray, saying,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.

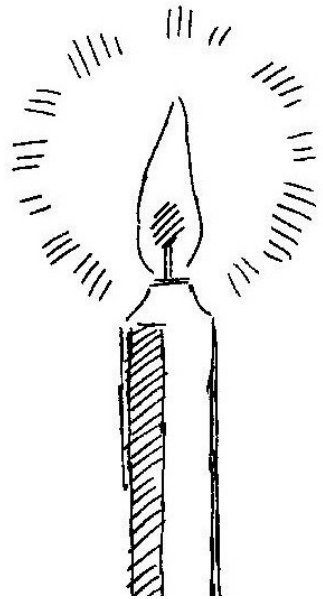
