# From the Heart

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the baptismal liturgy, and on occasions when we gather at the font to receive new members, celebrate Baptism of the Lord Sunday, or when someone renews their baptismal vows we often hear the words: Remember the waters of your baptism. The phrase invites us to harken back to when we were baptized and to remember not only the meaning of baptism, but the time when we passed through those same

cleansing waters.

When I think about my baptism, I get a mostly warm feeling, though I must confess I also feel a tinge of regret. The reason: I do not remember the waters of my baptism. As far as I know, there was nothing notable about my baptism, except maybe that it took place on April Fools Day—and I only know this because I stumbled upon my baptismal certificate a few years ago. I did not have an experience like Becca who stood before the

congregation as an adult and professed her faith in Jesus. I was not immersed as some of my friends were, whether in a river, lake, or baptistry. I did not see the heavens open up as Jesus did when he was baptized. My only recollection, and it is a vague one at that, is that we had cake.

I was six and a half years old when I said yes to Jesus. At least that is what my baptismal certificate says. That certificate and the photo of me and Pastor Natwick standing in the sanctuary

# **Inclement Weather Policy**

In light of the Christmas snow, it is always wise to review our policy in terms of winter weather. In general, it will not be our policy to cancel our Sunday services at 8:30 or 11 am. We have a plan to clear and salt the parking lot in time for service, so the church will be accessible.



The decision to cancel Sunday services (in the case of truly dangerous weather conditions) will be made by 7:30 am on Sunday morning. Cancellations will be communicated on our website, <u>fpcpa.org</u>, our Facebook page, or by email.

Daytime: If the Port Angeles public schools are closed due to weather-related problems, the office will be closed and daytime events will be canceled until 5 pm. If day events were canceled, evening events are canceled unless participants hear otherwise from their program leader. If the schools are running late call the church office to see if the church will be open. Or set up a

Zoom meeting through the office, as an alternative to canceling an in-person meeting.

If conditions keep you from traveling, then please take caution and stay home.

No event requires your attendance if you feel that weather conditions are dangerous. It is your right and responsibility to determine whether it is safe and/or wise to travel when road conditions may be hazardous.

of Central Lutheran Church in Eugene, Oregon, are the only proof I have of the event. I don't remember approaching the font, the feeling of water on my forehead, the touch of the pastor's hand as he blessed me, or having my name announced to the congregation. It is a bummer.

Over the years, I have learned to cope with my baptismal anxiety. I suppress my envy and smile politely when people tell me about their adult baptisms. I empathize with people who were baptized as babies but wish they could have claimed their vows themselves...even as I wonder how much my six and a half year-

old self really knew about Jesus when I said my "I dos" in front of the congregation 48 years ago. Does any of this resonate with vou?

Do you suffer from baptism anxiety? Or do you ever experience its sister disorder: baptism superiority complex? (Baptism superiority complex is where people who were baptized as adults-typically by immersionsecretly question the efficacy of infant or sprinkle baptisms.) If so, then the first step is to simply name it and get it out on the table. These disorders can turn remembering the waters of baptism into questioning the

waters of baptism, and nothing could be further from the intent of the sacrament.

I hope this will provide you with some mental and spiritual fodder in preparation for January 9, when we will celebrate Baptism of the Lord Sunday and be invited to remember and renew our baptisms. We will also dive a little deeper into these matters of baptism anxiety and baptism superiority complex, and how we can address them in our lives. Until then, remember the waters *of your baptism*...or at least try.

# One Parish One Prisoner News

A member of the OPOP team donated three copies of the book Halfway Home by Reuben Miller to the church. Look for them on the table outside the office or at the Connection Center. Miller, a former chaplain at a Chicago jail and a sociologist studying mass incarceration, spent years alongside prisoners, ex-prisoners, their friends, and their families to understand the lifelong burden that even a single arrest can entail. What his work revealed is a simple but overlooked truth: life after incarceration is its own form of prison. Recently released individuals are faced with jobs that are off-limits, apartments that can't be occupied, and votes that can't be cast. Belonging is one of our basic human needs and with citizenship restrictions after incarceration, it is extremely difficult to belong again. I recommend the book.




# The Message of Acts is for You in 2022!

# Book Club: *The Soul of An Octopus, A Surprising Exploration into the Wonder of Consciousness*


#### Thursday, January 20, at 10:30 am in the Fellowship Hall




# PA Food Bank Helpers

## Mac & Cheese Casserole

1 can whole kernel corn, do not drain

1 can creamed corn

1 cup macaroni, uncooked

1/2 cup butter, cut into pieces

8 oz. Velveeta, cut into cubes

Mix all ingredients together. Put it into a prepared medium casserole dish.

Bake 30 minutes, covered. Remove from oven & stir well. Return to oven & bake 30 minutes more.

Variations: Add 2 cups frozen whole kernel corn in place of canned kernel corn.


If doubling use 1/2 cup chicken broth & 1/2 cup butter as cuts amount of fat & keeps sauce from being too greasy.





The office is behind the church building off the alley and is handicapped accessible.


