From the Heart

Dear Friends in Christ,

Oh little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by. Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting Light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

The hymn runs through my head as I contemplate the Advent season with a fresh perspective on Jesus' birthplace, where the hopes and fears of all the years still meet in a deepening Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

The hillside where the shepherds kept watch over their flocks the night of Jesus' birth now overlooks a massive concrete wall that snakes across the valley below, dividing Israel from the Occupied Palestinian Territory. Were Joseph and Mary to retrace their journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem today, they would have to cross a checkpoint into an area controlled by the Palestinian Authority, where signs on the Israeli side warn travelers: Entrance for Israeli Citizens is Forbidden, Dangerous to Your Lives, and Against Israeli Law.



Bethlehem and the surrounding area have certainly changed over the millennia. Its political boundaries have

One Parish One Prisoner News Update

"Starting from scratch" is an apt description of the situation a person releasing from prison is facing. They will have minimal transportation money, \$40, a prepaid cell phone, and the clothes on their back. They typically leave owing court charges and have requirements to see their Community Corrections Officer. Additionally, they must find a place to live, a job, and all the related activities that require transportation. No car. No drivers license. The growing knot in their stomach is more than physical hunger. Our releasing friend, Jordan will soon be in that place, February 10, to be exact. Her family will not be there to meet her when she releases in

Gig Harbor.

Our OPOP team is preparing with Jordan for her release: looking into housing options, area employers, after-school programs for her son, and access to medical support. She will also need some initial financial assistance for setting up a residence, interviewing and work clothes, rent, money for a driver's license and/or bus pass, to name just a few things. Starting from scratch, right?!

On January 15 the OPOP team will be organizing an event (keep watching the eNews for particulars) to give you an opportunity to help either in kind or cash to give Jordan the opportunity for a new start. Keep her in your prayers. Be thinking of how you might be able to help. And yes, the OPOP team will be there to meet Jordan on her release date.

Thankfully, God's love for humanity remains constant. Despite our waywardness, God is ever searching, ever

welcoming, ever embracing. God's love is more timeless than the stars and more powerful than any human barriers, be they walls of concrete or hearts of stone.

As we sing of the Bethlehem of Judea, let us pray for the Bethlehem of Palestine, and for the welfare of all of God's children who inhabit the land of our Savior's birth. And together, let us sing with hope and expectation:

O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray.
Cast out our sin and enter in; be born in us today.
We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell;
O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Immanuel!


FPCPA Book Club: *The Four Winds* by Kristin Hannah



Christmas Joy Offering 2022

As we are a blessing to our local church, we can be a blessing to those who are in the wider body of Jesus Christ. The Christmas Joy Offering provides assistance to current and retired church workers and their families in their time of need and develops our future leaders at Presbyterian-related schools and colleges

equipping communities of color.



Fifty percent of the funds (\$1.1 million in 2021) are used to provide critical financial support and grants for current and retired Presbyterian church workers in their time of need. Income supplements from the Board of Pensions helped nearly 278 individual recipients, assisting retired church workers and surviving spouses with the means to provide for themselves. Housing supplements from the Board of Pensions helped more than 227 individual recipients remain in their homes, afford assisted living, or

long-term care. Emergency Assistance Grants from the Board of Pensions helped more than 246 individual recipients facing times of great need or uncertainty due to unforeseen circumstances.

The other 50% of the funds will be used to help develop our future leaders at Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color. \$1.1 million of gifts from 2020 were given for this purpose. Many of the students attending Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color are the first in their families to enroll in higher education. There are three institutions that are supported by the Christmas Joy offering: Menaul School in Albuquerque, NM (menaulschool.com), Presbyterian Pan American School in Kingsville, TX (ppas.org), and Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, AL (stillman.edu).

You may give through the regular church offering by writing a check to FPCPA and entering Christmas Joy offering on the memo of your check or you may give online. We will take the offering on December 11th and 18th.

Thanks be to God for his love for all of God's people and for his love for each one of us.

own at other days/times as the Food Bank staff works to develop its programs, including the new Market - a shopping approach for clients. That means, if you are going other than with our group, please contact the Food Bank about your volunteer effort: Monica, mwilliams@portangelesfoodbank.org. They have driving, packing, and distributing jobs, depending upon the volunteer's schedule and physical needs.

Also a major fundraiser for the Food Bank was canceled recently, so please consider donating \$\$\$ to this organization.



This year, through the international relief organization Samaritan's Purse, our congregation is sending a total of **106** shoebox gifts to children around the world who are living in difficult circumstances. That total reflects **28** physical boxes and **78** boxes built online. Our physical boxes are to go to Mongolia, and the boxes we built online can be shipped to areas that are hardest to reach, wherever they are.

The boxes are given with gospel story booklets, and many of the children who receive them are invited to take part in a follow-up discipleship course. With these boxes we are giving the children what may be the only gift they've ever received and an opportunity to receive the greatest gift of all, salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. Please pray for these children and their families and communities, and for all involved in the delivery of the gifts.



- 5. Hide stones for younger siblings to find, set out a new stone each day or order them in a row and tell the Nativity story.
